

CBH Vision Statement

To better aid the Offeror's concepts, CBH has provided the following statement concerning its initial thoughts for Phase 2 of the campus and the consolidated outpatient and administrative building design.

"We want to build a facility that demonstrates the staff and services within are welcoming, inclusive, compassionate, and free of judgment—especially for individuals living with substance use disorders, serious mental illness, or developmental disabilities. This space should feel safe, calm, and supportive, reflecting dignity and respect for every person who enters. This building will affirm that recovery, wellness, and quality of life are priorities for our community, and that families, caregivers, and support networks are valued partners in the process. While the services offered—behavioral health, primary care, dental, and pharmacy—are not new to our community, this facility will allow them to be delivered in more integrated and innovative ways. For everyone and their support systems, the building should represent not only access to care, but a clear path toward stability, healing, and lasting positive change."

CBH Style Preferences

CBH envisions the new building as architecturally cohesive with the Center for Support and Wellness currently under construction on the campus. While not identical in design, the new facility should share complementary features that create a unified character across the site. Its placement should provide a clear visual connection to the existing building and allow for an efficient, logical layout of the overall campus.

CBH wants the entrance to be welcoming, perhaps including a circular driveway, or a covered entrance, or some other way to make a statement of both welcome and importance.
